

Canadian Peony Society 2025 Seed List [Harvest 2024]

Hello Peony Friends,

My name is John Moons. This is the eighth year that I am co-ordinating the Seed Exchange for the Canadian Peony Society.

This year we received seed from 10 donors and we would like to thank them. Twenty minutes south of Brantford ON. is a privately-owned botanical garden called Whistling Gardens. The owners, Darren and Wanda Heimbecker, have the biggest peony collection in North America with more than 1,200 different peonies. The Heimbeckers were again kind enough to let me harvest their peony seeds. I spent 6 afternoons collecting seeds. The weather was always great and I get to see thousands of different conifers.

We also have to say a big THANK YOU to Bill Wegman. He sent me the seeds of more than 80 different peonies and a good number of them are the very popular seeds of the crossings. Thank you Bill! Our American friend Gregory Rockwell sent me almost 750 seeds of mostly woody peonies. He even sent 81 seeds of Lutea Hybrid Woody Peony crosses that he made in 2024. When you buy those seeds you never know what will come out of it. The fabulous peonies that Nassos Daphnis and William Gratwick brought out about 40 years ago all had Lutea genes in their chromosomes. Gregory has it very well organized and he always gives me the number of all the seeds he sends me. Thank you very much Gregory!

This year we can offer more than 9,400 seeds of 284 different peonies. Over the last 8 years we have offered for sale more than 153,000 seeds (that was a lot of counting!). The number of seeds we can offer this year is only about 35 % of what we had last year and the number of different peonies that gave us seeds is down to 284 from 404 last year.

Here in Ontario near Brantford (Whistling Gardens and our own garden) we noticed that the setting of seeds was very modest. A lot of peonies that gave us a lot of seeds in the past, had last fall a very limited number of seeds. We do not know the reason. We also had fewer people sending in seeds. We did get a fair amount of seeds from people who live a distant away from Brantford

Ordering

The number of seeds in each packet depends on how many seeds of that particular peony were collected. This year we have a few a good number of peonies that gave us only one or two seeds, but there are also have some peonies with more than 150 seeds.

Please list a few alternatives for each choice. You may certainly order more than one packet. For the first month of the listing I will limit orders to a maximum of 3 packets of seeds of each individual peony. Non-members of the Canadian Peony Society may order from the list, but where quantities are scarce, members' orders will have priority. Remember to include your mailing address with your order, or a mailing label if you have one.

We will send you a message to confirm the price for your order. There are three ways to pay.

- e-transfer your payment from your bank account to treasurer@peony.ca. No password is required.
- mail a cheque or money order (in Canadian funds) payable to the Canadian Peony Society to the address above. Do not send cash through the mail.
- pay with PayPal or major credit card using the web link we will send you when we confirm your order.

The price is the same as last year, but the mailing charge has gone up to \$ 3.00 for every 5 packets. If you compare the price of the seeds of our peonies with seeds of other plants (Cannabis!), then I believe the price is very reasonable. And a peony plant can last you a life time! Cost is \$3.00 per packet plus a shipping charge of \$3.00 for every 5 packets shipped out.

For example: 5 packets: \$15.00 + \$3.00 = \$18.00, 6 packets: \$18.00 + \$6.00 = \$24.00,

10 packets: \$30.00 + \$6.00 = \$36.00, 11 packets: \$33.00 + \$9.00 = \$42.00.

If you want to be able to track the travel of your order, the cost for the tracking is on top of the regular charges.

Everything is in Canadian funds.

We have all intentions to sell and mail seeds to our Americans friends. They have been very good to us in the past and we certainly do not want to let them down because of some stupid ideas that a bunch of people in Washington have come up with. We have to see what happens. We probably will try a small order and take it from there. We will have to ask you for patience; just stay in touch with us. For shipping at this point we will charge you the same \$ 3.00 for 5 packets that we charge our other customers.

Important notes - Unless you have the seeds of man-made crosses (# 175-187 and 271-285) the seeds are the results of open pollination (O/P). We do not know where the insects took the pollen from.

- The name you see on the list is the name of the pod (mother) plant; the father is unknown. The plants and flowers that grow out of these seeds can have any colour, shape or size, even if they come from the same pod. They might not look like the mother plant at all.
- The seeds of peonies have a double dormancy before they grow leaves. Dormancy is a condition in which the seed will not germinate. Before anything happens the seed has to be exposed to moisture and then first go through a period of warm temperatures (summer) and then after that, the seed has to be exposed to a period of cold temperatures (winter). Do not change the sequence. Do not let the seeds dry out in this whole process. This process is called a double stratification. You can start the seeds indoors, but you need space in a fridge for a few months.
- When the seeds do not come up in the first spring after you have planted them, leave everything in the ground and there is a very good chance that they will come up a year later or even two or three years later. Make sure that you keep the soil where you put the seeds, damp all at all times and keep an eye out for rodents, birds and insects. Mark the location. Have lots of patience.
- The names you see on the list are the names that I took from the labels near the plants or the names that people gave me. We tried to find the correct spelling, but sometimes it is very hard to find the right information. In general we used the spelling that you see in the Peony Registry of the American Peony Society, but not always.
- If you want to see a picture of the flower from which the seed was taken, you can see most of those pictures on the the web site of the Peony Registry of the American Peony Society.

Woody (Tree) Peonies

Important notes

Woody peonies more than herbaceous peonies, need usually TWO (2) periods of warm and cool temperatures to germinate. An example is as follows: seeds planted May-July 2025, summer 2025, winter 2025/2026, summer 2026, winter 2026/2027, spring 2027 the seeds will come up. Some of the seeds will come up in the spring of 2026, but do not count on it. Most of the seeds will come up in the spring of 2027, but some will come up in 2028 or 2029 or even later. Keep the seeds moist all that time! Keep an eye out for rodents, birds and insects. One lady who purchased our seeds, had peonies coming up all over the garden after her chickens found her seedbed. Woody peonies test your garden patience, but the rewards are great! All the seeds are of garden origin, open pollinated unless otherwise stated. The packet content is as indicated, * means there is only a very limited number of seeds available and *** means that we have only one seed.
